LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES

Many portable devices such as laptop computers, mobile phones, children's toys, e-scooters, e-bikes and e-cigarettes may contain rechargeable lithium-ion batteries.

Most rechargeable devices contain lithium-ion batteries.

Only charge batteries on hard surfaces in a room where a working smoke alarm is present.

Never charge a device under your pillow, on your bed or on a couch.

You should always purchase products from trusted suppliers.

Lithium-ion batteries can catch fire if you use the wrong charger or modify the battery or appliance they charge.

Lithium-ion batteries should never be disposed of in your household rubbish bin.

If your battery catches fire, ring 000 immediately and wait in a safe location for firefighters to arrive.

It is not safe to attempt to put the fire out yourself, as batteries involved in fires can release toxic gases and generate multiple explosions.
